

ROSES CRICKET 2026 SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

Roses Cricket powered by Dynamos is back for 2026! After seeing over 50 clubs run Roses programmes in 2025 and girls making up 49% of Dynamos Participants the YCF are excited to continue to support the growth of girls cricket in clubs, schools and community groups. The Supporting Documents will guide new centers through the process as well as giving top tips, new ideas and games for returning programmes.

WHAT IS ROSES CRICKET?



Club Consultation

- As part of the consultation process, YCF staff will outline the benefits of running Girls Only Dynamos. The offer and plans for 2026 will be shared and the club will have an opportunity to ask any questions.
- Activator training will be provided before the start of the programme.

Girls Only Dynamos

- The club will deliver the Dynamos Programme as either an 8 week training course or as a Holiday camp.
- Any support needed during the programme will go through YCF staff in order to improve experiences.

Festivals/ Competition

- Following the completion of the Dynamos Programme, clusters will be created for local clubs to attend a festival day celebrating their programme.
- The Festival will be a mixture of skills and game based activities

Dynamos Leagues

- At completion of the Festival Days, clubs will be invited to enter a short league created to continue the competition element of the game
- The league will be based upon those that enter and can be made up of 3+ teams depending on entry.
- League games will be played on either an evening or Sunday morning with multiple teams traveling to 1 host ground
- A league table will be formatted

Club Support

- As a club, your success is our top priority. The YCF is committed to supporting clubs, volunteers, and leagues throughout this process by offering resources, workshops, and financial assistance when needed.

In June and July 2026 England and Wales are hosting the ICC Women's T20 World Cup. In order to continue growing the opportunities for young people to play cricket, the England and Wales Cricket Board is inviting schools to participate in **Schools Cricket Day on Thursday 23rd April 2026**, a national day celebrating 50 days before the ICC Women's T20 World Cup.

The aim is to embed cricket, and specifically the ICC Women's T20 World Cup, across the curriculum throughout the day, allowing children to participate in cricket related activities, learn about the tournament and inspire a love of the game. From stats and scoring in maths, to an understanding of the geography and culture of the countries of the teams taking part, through to a whole school art exhibition of the colour and vibrancy of the game – there will be something for all schools to get involved with.

Schools Cricket Day offers a flexible menu of activity that is designed to fit around the school timetable so schools can pick and choose what they do. This process will also connect your school with the relevant local cricket organisations to allow for ongoing opportunities for cricket activity for your students.




UPLOADING YOUR PROGRAMME


Once you've determined the start date for Roses Cricket, you'll need to upload the Dynamos Programme to Clubspark. Clubspark is an online platform that helps you set up and track your Dynamos Programme. After registering your club, the system will prompt you to provide essential details, including contact information, DBS checks, First Aid certification, club insurance, and Activator Training. Below is a step-by-step guide for uploading your club's information. If you have any questions, please reach out to your Regional W&G Manager.

The ClubSpark Page is your hub for all things National Programmes! From here you can upload your documents, access your training, create your programme and track registrations. This page shows your clubs checklist. Click on Coaching in the grey menu to access your personal checklist...



New activators are required to attend an in-person activator training session. You can access online training and upload your DBS in the Coaches Checklist.

To upload your programme, go to: **Programmes > Select Dynamos > Create a New Course** > You will then be able to enter your programme details. You may want to add Roses Cricket into the reference name e.g. CLUBNAME - Roses Cricket. Make sure to select Girls in the gender drop-down list. The RRP is set at £50. If you wish to reduce this cost please contact your Regional W&G Manager and we will assist you with this.

SCHOOLS

The Dynamos Programme is versatile and can be delivered in a range of spaces. A great way to reach local girls is to deliver your programme as an after-school club. Below is a quick how-to guide for delivering your programme in a school:

Set-up

First you will need to contact your local primary school. You can use the Roses Cricket Promotional Pack to get the school on board. Discuss with the school what the programme can offer them (e.g., extra curricular activities, skill development etc.). Decide a day that fits your coaches and the school, then upload your programme to clubspark. You will need to inform the school who will be coaching and provide their DBS Number as well as ID on arrival. You can ask the school to promote the programme through their parent channels. If you have the resource, a taster session can be a great way to inspire the children. Send a coach in during the day to deliver taster sessions for the girls.

Delivery

Liaise with the school to plan your arrival and set-up. You may need to adjust your plans for the space they have, both inside and outside. Ask the school if there is a wet weather plan and if you are able to use the hall space. Ask the school to support with a register and staff where available.

Consider how you can make the sessions engaging for the girls: Could you play music during the session? Could the participants be responsible for picking their team song? Challenge the girls to complete a task before the song ends, Create a vlog or video celebrating the girls success (parental consent needed) Share your successes on social media and tag @Yorkshire.cf #RosesCricket #DynamosCricket Play games of Countdown Cricket to prepare the girls for the Roses Festivals

Next Steps

Once your 8 week programme is complete, invite the participants to your cricket club for a follow up session. Liaise with the school to consider a trip to support this. Continue Dynamos sessions at the club for the participants. Check out the information on Roses Festivals and sign up to your local festival. You can then check out the information for Roses Leagues



FESTIVAL RULES

TEAMS

- Teams can be made up of 6 players
- Games will last for 12 overs / sets (5 balls)
- 6 overs / sets per innings
- Every player will bowl
- Fielders will move around after each over

THE GAME

- The game will be scored on the Countdown Cricket App
- 5 runs added to the bowling team for a Wicket
- 3 runs for a Wide or No Ball (3+ bounces) *No Extra Ball
- Highest Score Wins

KIT

- Dynamos Windballs
- Dynamos Stumps
- Dynamos Bats (where available)
- Flat markers (fielding positions)
- Cones (crease)



SET-UP

PRIOR

- Teams will enter via a WhatsApp group 5 days prior
- Centers / Clubs can enter as many girls as they have available
- Teams will be made up on the day if not already
- Numbers will determine how many pitches are needed

THE DAY

- A fun, quick warm up will welcome the girls (examples given)
- Teams and Fixtures will be clarified
- Rules will be explained
- The girls will play 3 / 4 games depending on numbers
- A coach / appropriate activator should umpire



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
WARM UPS

'R-P-S' TIG

ROCK-PAPER-SCISSORS Tig is a great way of getting everyone moving. All participants start with 3 objects (these could be cones, balls, beanbags etc). Running around they tig someone and play R-P-S, loser gives the winner a cone. They must then run and tig someone else. The game continues for a set period of time. Most Cones Wins!



CONE DASH



Teams line up behind a single stump. 1 at a time they run forward and collect a cone placing it on their stump and high-5 the next person. Each round can add a rule eg, different colour each time, 2 at a time, R-P-S winner gets the cone etc. The winner could be the most or you could have a secret winning code such as top cone must be yellow! The participants must figure this out...

*this warm-up requires a lot of cones!!

TREASURE

Teams must complete 10 catches to collect a piece of treasure from the middle of the 'island'. Rounds can be added to allow teams to steal from each other. You could also time the game and have them give the treasure to another team to 'frame' them! The catches could get harder or the ball could change!




PITCH SET UP

- Flat markers will be used to show girls fielding positions and allow them to move around with ease after each over.
*Where they are not available cones may be used



FESTIVAL FIXTURES



Template based on 8 teams with 3 games per festival

All games are played in friendly fashion with no points associated to results.

Fixtures and pitches should be adapted to reflect numbers with as many teams playing at once as possible.

Consider playing music and putting on an event! You could use this as an opportunity to celebrate your club and have a fun day.

FAQ'S

We hope these supporting documents have given you the tools you need to participate in Roses Cricket! We have answered some frequently asked questions below. If you require further support please get in touch with your Regional W&G Manager.

Q What age does Roses Cricket Target?

Roses Cricket is Powered By Dynamos a programme for 8-11 year olds.

Q Is there a charge for Roses Cricket?

The Roses Cricket programme is a free initiative to support clubs to run Girls Only Dynamos. Dynamos is currently set at £50pp but this can be reduced at the clubs request (minimum £15pp). If you believe your club or community would benefit from financial support please contact your Regional W&G Manager.

Q We already run National Programmes. How is this different?

The Roses Cricket programme aims to support the running of Girls Only National Programmes. By providing clubs with the tools they need to set-up/or support a girls section. Giving girls the freedom to explore the skill away from a mixed session, some girls find they can thrive in this space. The Roses Cricket programme aims to inspire young girls through the Yorkshire CCC Womens team igniting a passion for the game. The introduction of festivals and leagues supports the transition of girls through into a club set-up giving them a taste of fixtures and competition.

Q Can ladies from the senior softball team help run the session?

Absolutely, this is a great way to inspire the girls providing role models in the game. New 'Activators' (helpers) can attend an Activator training course.

Q What qualification do coaches need? Are there any courses coming up?

To support a Dynamos Session 'activators' must attend an in person training course and complete the online safeguarding course. They must also hold an ECB DBS. There will be regionalised Activator Training Courses popping up around the county and these can be found on the Clubspark portal within your checklist. Coaches looking to further their qualifications may choose to attend a Foundation or Core Coach Course. Visit the YCB website to find your nearest course.

Q What equipment do we need to run Roses Cricket?

Clubs who are new to Dynamos will receive a full kit bag. The programme can be delivered with plastic bats, stumps, balls and cones.

Q How do we order the Roses Tshirt and is this to replace the yellow Dynamos top?

Participants can order their Roses T-shirt from the Lacuna website. Clubs may also chose to order for their players and/or coaches. All Roses (Dynamos) participants will still receive their yellow Dynamos top when signing up to a programme.

What the data shows


